Jane recognized a number of "behind-the-scenes" volunteers who work on LCM's behalf to pick up food at our grocery partners and devote skills and volunteer hours to a variety of special committees and projects including A Child's Christmas. Linda Strup, A Simple Gesture Coordinator, gave an update on the program's growth. More than 300 donor households now donate nearly 10,000 pounds of food and cleaning supplies each year. Linda recognized the many pick-up drivers who collect A Simple Gesture donations each quarter in their neighborhoods and deliver the items to LCM.

Penhook Food Remote Moves to Christ Community Church

Each month LCM sends food supplies to support the Penhook Remote Food Assistance Program for families who live in Penhook and Pittsylvania County and have a difficult time traveling to LCM in Moneta. For many years, Penhook United Methodist Church hosted the Penhook Remote Food Day on the second Thursday morning of each month with volunteer assistance from Christ Community Church and Crafts United Methodist Church. In April, the Penhook Food Assistance Program moved to Christ Community Church. Church volunteer Anne Woods serves as the Penhook Remote Coordinator. Assisting her are nearly 30 Christ Community volunteers who are working each month to help LCM meet the food needs of nearly 45 families in this area. Thank you to all the Penhook Remote Food Assistance volunteers!

Service Impact January – April 2023

During the first four months of 2023, Lake Christian Ministries volunteers and staff continued to see a growing number of service requests. Rising costs for gas, rent and utility service have significantly impacted low- income families who are struggling to make ends meet. Many are working in our New Tomorrows Program to overcome barriers toward building stability for themselves and their families.

From January – April 2023, LCM Provided:

Food Assistance to Fulfill **3,125 Food Requests** 31% increase over the same period in 2022

Financial Aid in the amount of \$97,272 to assist 232 families 27% increase over the same period in 2022

Facility Expansion Update

The first quarter of the year has been devoted to site and building plan review meetings with Bedford County Community Development Office. A few adjustments to the site plan were made to comply with easements on the building site. A second Technical Review Committee meeting will be held soon. We are hopeful that the site and building plans will be approved in the next 30 days and construction can begin in June/July. The new building will address the growing need for service space by housing a warehouse, clothing area and classrooms. Moving the warehouse and clothing area to the new facility will free space in the existing center to add additional meeting rooms. This new space is badly needed as demand for LCM's services has grown by 31% in the first half of this year.

Capital Campaign Update

We are happy to report that the **Building Hope for Tomorrow Capital Campaign** has received \$927,000 to date. The initial campaign goal of \$700,000 was increased to \$950,000 as building costs significantly increased due to inflation.

"We are hopeful that the community will help us generate the remaining \$33,000 needed by fall so the new facility can be completed by early 2024," said Jane Winters, LCM Executive Director. "With growing needs from our neighbors, more space is required to accommodate a much larger number of families seeking LCM services. When this facility expansion project is completed, the benefits to the neighbors we serve will be truly life-changing."

Bridges Out of Poverty Class Offered on July 18

Bridges Out of Poverty is a national training program that examines the dynamics that cause and sustain poverty. Anyone who works with people in poverty will benefit from a deeper understanding of their strengths and challenges. Lessons learned from this class will also help make us better partners in creating opportunities for our neighbors' success.

The training will be facilitated by Andy Crawford, Bedford County Department of Social Services Director and Lake Christian Ministries Board Member. Andy is an excellent instructor and shares first-hand experience and hands-on group exercises to broaden participants' understanding of life in poverty.

A Simple Gesture Program Helps Those in Need & Reduces LCM Expenses

Donations from A Simple Gesture SML are helping our neighbors in need and helping to reduce LCM expenses during a time when food costs continue rising for all of us. This neighborhood donation pick-up program provides thousands of pounds of food, cleaning supplies and personal care items each year. In the first quarter of this year, the collection provided 2,104 pounds of canned fruit from 158 donors.

The second quarter collection day is Friday, June 2, with a wish list for shampoo, soap, deodorant, toothpaste and toothbrushes. The next two quarterly pick-ups are scheduled for Friday, August 4, for canned green beans, corn, and carrots; and Friday, November 3, for laundry detergent and dishwashing liquid.
