Join the 2024 Challenge: \$15,000 Matching Gift Boosts SML Gives Day for Our Neighbors

SML Gives, an online giving event to support charities that serve the Smith Mountain Lake region, presents Lake Christian Ministries supporters with an ideal way to help many in our area struggling to make ends meet. A \$15,000 matching challenge has been offered by three dedicated LCM volunteers to propel us toward our \$40,000 goal.

"This is a wonderful opportunity for donors to leverage their gifts to Lake Christian Ministries through the 2024 SML Gives Day. Each \$1 of the first \$15,000 donated will be matched by a \$1," explained LCM Executive Director Jane Winters. "Our LCM supporters have generously stepped up to make the most of matching funds in years past, and we are hopeful they will do so again. Two years of rising costs have generated a 40% increase in the number of families who are seeking our services."

Now in its third year, SML Gives will take place on March 13 with a goal of generating \$200,000 for the 38 participating Bedford and Franklin county nonprofits.



For early contributions to Lake Christian Ministries, donors may visit smlgives.org beginning March 11. The donation window closes at 11:59 p.m. on March 13.

Secure online donations are made by credit card, but checks and cash may also be dropped off at Lake Christian Ministries beginning March 11 or at a donor hospitality event on March 13 at SML Coffee House at Bridgewater Plaza. Stop by from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. to enjoy a complimentary box lunch, mingle with LCM staff and board members and get assistance processing your donation.

SML Gives will also hold a non-profit forum at the SML YMCA from 4 to 7 p.m. on March 13 where SML residents can familiarize themselves with the many ways they can help the less fortunate in our community – and make donations to any of the 38 participating charities.

SML Gives helps raise awareness for the work being done in the SML community to assist area residents who struggle through a subsistence-level existence, trying desperately to stay warm, fed and healthy and, in many cases, raise children who can break the poverty cycle.

"Inflationary costs are affecting us all, but **low-income families are especially hard hit as they struggle with rising prices for food, transportation, housing and utilities**," Winters emphasized. "Every day, LCM volunteers see the worry in the faces of those who come to us for help. We are so grateful that our volunteers were able to offer **\$15,000 in matching funds** to jump start our SML Gives Day response."

Facility Update

Construction is well underway for Lake Christian Ministries' new 5,000-square-foot building located adjacent to our existing facility. The new building will feature a learning center, clothing area, warehouse for furniture and household items, loading dock for receiving donations, and additional parking. Price Buildings' project manager has set a completion date for the end of May. This new facility will work in conjunction with LCM's existing facility to provide a comprehensive center that will offer food assistance, crisis financial aid, clothing, furniture, and New Tomorrows services, which include job readiness, educational classes and connections to community services.

"The need for the new facility is due to the **significant increase in the number** of low-income families who have been impacted by rising costs for food, housing and utilities and a need for space to support our New Tomorrows program. We have learned that providing food, clothing and crisis financial aid doesn't always bring the change needed to transition out of poverty. **New Tomorrows Program services are vital** to helping our neighbors move toward **more secure lives.** When completed, the expanded facilities and new campus will serve Lake Christian Ministries and the growing number of local families in need well into the future," commented Jane Winters, LCM Director.

Construction for the new facility is funded by a capital campaign that was launched in 2022 as part of LCM's 30th anniversary. The honorary chairs of the capital campaign are Dave and Cindy Cappellari, owners of Capps Home Building Center. To date, a very generous group of community donors have joined the Cappellari family to provide more than \$960,000 to address building expenses. The capital campaign is about \$50,000 short of addressing building expenses.

Building Stronger Futures: LCM's Getting Ahead Classes

As demand for Lake Christian Ministries' services grows, so has participation in the New Tomorrows Program. During 2021, 130 individuals participated in the New Tomorrows Program. Last year, a total of 259 neighbors actively participated in the program - a 99% increase over the past two years.

The New Tomorrows' featured offering, "Getting Ahead in a Just Gettin' By World" (GA), is a nationally acclaimed 14-week series of classes designed to help neighbors journey toward positive change. Participants examine barriers to moving forward, identify strengths and areas for growth and set goals to build a more secure future. Since the fall of 2016, Lake Christian Ministries has been a nurturing space for individuals through the GA classes. Designed for a small group of 8-12 participants, a total of 129 individuals have participated over the past seven years. The current class, facilitated by LCM's New Tomorrows Director Susan Hughes, includes 11 participants.

Facilitated by dedicated staff and volunteers, these classes go beyond the workbook, incorporating engaging elements such as YouTube videos to illustrate language nuances and "hidden rules" of economic classes. However, GA is more than an information-sharing platform; it's a community builder. The synergy within the class becomes a resource in itself, fostering a supportive environment.

Volunteer partners attend classes to journey alongside GA participants. In the current winter 2024 class, three volunteers play this crucial supportive role. Beyond the classroom, graduates often form lasting connections and a desire to continue to meet together for additional learning on topics such as parenting, budgeting and nutrition. This ongoing support network underscores the importance of strong relationships in achieving the goals set by our neighbors.

While the primary goal is to empower neighbors to build resources for a more secure future, the continued success of our neighbors emphasizes the critical role of supportive relationships. At LCM, we recognize that fostering a sense of community is key to helping individuals meet and exceed the goals they set for themselves.

Make A SIMPLE GESTURE in 2024!

LCM's donation pick-up program called "A Simple Gesture" continues in 2024. This popular program makes donating easy and increases inventory at our food pantry. During 2023, donors donated over 12,000 pounds of food, personal care and household cleaning items. 2023's four quarterly collections and one emergency collection were supported by 328 registered donors and 18 neighborhood pick-up drivers. Donations received from A Simple Gesture offer an average annual savings of \$25,000 for LCM.

Sadly, two years of high inflation have significantly impacted those struggling with poverty in the counties surrounding SML. A Simple Gesture helps local families in need address food insecurity and helps LCM stretch its budget further.

HOW IT WORKS:

- Community members register as donors and/or volunteer drivers.
- LCM provides each donor with a reusable bag and wish list of desired items.
- Donors fill their bag and leave it outside their door on pre-determined days.
- Volunteer drivers pick up the bags (leaving an empty bag and wish list for the next pick-up) and deliver the bags to LCM.
- In neighborhoods where no driver is available, donors drop off bags at Lake Christian Ministries or Capps Home Building Center.
- LCM sorts, stores, and distributes the food, sharing with other pantries if needed.

PICK UP DATES and WISH LISTS for 2024

- Friday, March 1, 2024: canned applesauce, peaches, pears, or mandarin oranges
- Friday, June 7, 2024: shampoo, soap, deodorant, toothpaste, and tooth brushes
- Friday, August 2, 2024: canned green beans, corn and carrots
- Friday, November 1, 2024: laundry detergent (40 oz. or smaller) and dishwashing liquid
